

Curriculum Overviews

Mathematics

In Term 3, students are growing their understanding of numbers up to and beyond 1000. They are developing their understanding of larger numbers, working with early models of multiplication, exploring simple fractions, and recognising number patterns. These skills help them solve practical problems and see how numbers connect to everyday life. In

Measurement and Space, students use uniform units like, blocks or paper clips, to measure length or size. They sort shapes based on their features using language like side, corner, edge and face to describe shapes.

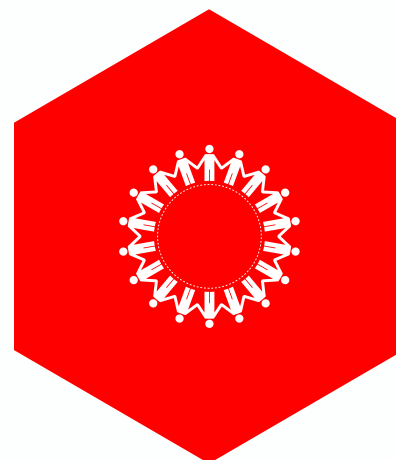


English

In Term 3, students further extend their fluency knowledge using phonics and morphology to become independent readers. They are developing their speaking skills by creating their own short spoken texts. Students learn to clearly express their opinions and preferences, especially about things like short films, and explore the structure of podcasts as a fun way to share ideas.

HASS

In Term 3, students are learning to observe and describe events that happen in their local community. This helps them understand how people come together, celebrate, and make their community a special place.



Health & Physical Education

In Year 2 Health this term, students are learning more about themselves and their feelings, how to care for their wellbeing and safety, and how to ask for help when they need it. In Physical Education, students build their physical skills through games and activities that develop coordination, balance and teamwork. They are developing their skills in kicking, passing and catching using techniques from Australian Rules Football. They're beginning to solve simple movement challenges by thinking, trying and testing different ways hitting a target.



Science

In Term 3 Science, students are discovering how different resources - like water, soil, and materials - have many important uses in our daily lives. They also explore examples of how science helps people every day, from growing plants to transportation.

The Arts

This semester for The Arts, Year 1 students will explore both Music and Dance. In Music, students explore how music connects to the world around them - especially the places and experiences in their own community. They learn to listen carefully, talk about what they hear, and express their ideas through rhythm and sound. In Dance, students are learning to express ideas through movement. They explore how dance can tell a story or show feelings - using the seasons as inspiration to move in different ways.
