

# Curriculum Overviews

## Mathematics

Students continue to build their understanding of fractions, decimals, and percentages, and begin to apply these skills to solve real-world problems. They also learn to make choices about which mathematical operations (like addition, subtraction, multiplication or division) to use and explain their results in everyday contexts. In Measurement and Space, students explore how three-dimensional objects relate to two-dimensional shapes and use measurement to describe and solve problems involving real-world quantities like length, weight, volume, area, and perimeter.

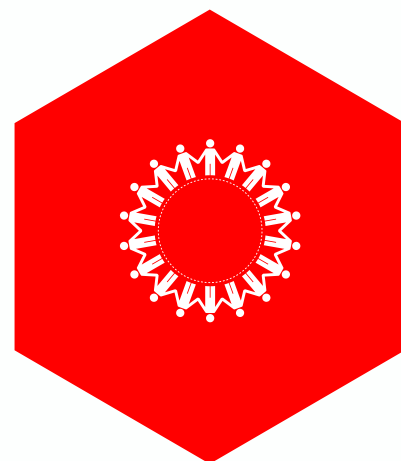


## English

This term, students are becoming more confident and intentional in the way they communicate ideas, both in writing and speaking. They learn how to tailor their message for specific audiences and purposes, using clear structure, relevant details, and expressive language.

## HASS

Students are learning how democracy works - not just in Australia, but in ways they can see experience directly within their school community. They explore how decisions are made fairly, how everyone can have a voice, and why shared values like respect, freedom, and fairness matter in a democratic society.



## Science

Students are exploring the idea that everything is made of matter - including solids, liquids, and gases. They're learning to observe, describe and sort materials based on how they look, felt, and behave. This helps them understand how scientists classify and make sense of the world around us.

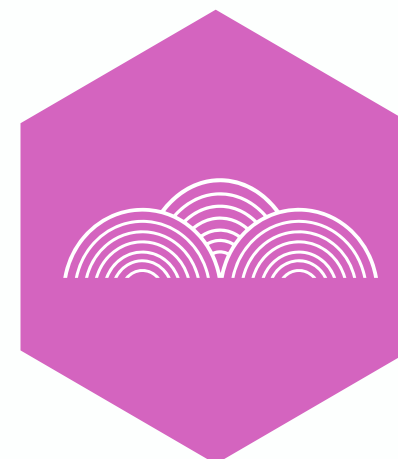
## Health & Physical Education

In Health, students explore how their actions and choices impact both their own wellbeing and the wellbeing of others. They are developing critical thinking and decision-making skills to help them make informed, respectful, and health-conscious choices in everyday life. In Physical Education, students develop key movement skills and begin to explore team strategies and game tactics through modified versions of football (across different codes: AFL, Rugby, Soccer).



## Japanese

Students develop their skills in reading, listening, and cultural understanding. They learn how to find key information from Japanese texts, translate familiar language, and explore important values and behaviours that are part of the Japanese society.



## The Arts

In The Arts this term, students delve deeper into Dance. They explore how different dance styles from past decades reflect the ideas, values, and trends of their time. They investigate how dancers use movement to express culture and communicate messages, and they apply this understanding by choreographing their own routines.
