

Curriculum Overviews

Mathematics

Students continue to build their understanding of fractions, decimals, and percentages, and begin to apply these skills to solve real-world problems. They also learn to make choices about which mathematical operations (like addition, subtraction, multiplication or division) to use and explain their results in everyday contexts. In Measurement and Space, students explore how three-dimensional objects relate to two-dimensional shapes and use measurement to describe and solve problems involving real-world quantities like length, weight, volume, area, and perimeter

English

Students will explore a range of texts and develop their reading, writing, speaking and listening skills. They will build ideas, use supporting details, choose effective vocabulary and create texts for different purposes and audiences.

HASS

Students will explore people, places, communities and events from the past and present. They will develop inquiry skills by asking questions, locating information, using sources and sharing their ideas.



Science

Students will explore scientific concepts through questioning, predicting and investigating. They will plan and conduct simple investigations, collect and record data and explain their findings using scientific vocabulary.

Health & Physical Education

Students will build skills for respectful relationships, teamwork and decision-making while participating in games and physical activities that develop movement, strategy and fair play.

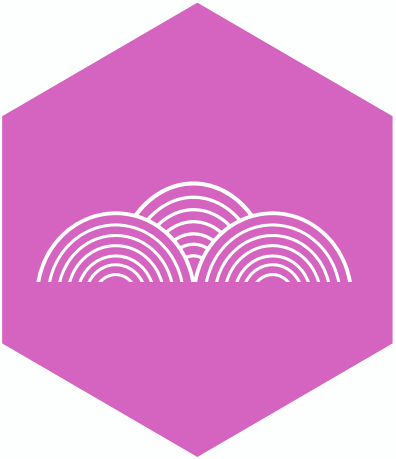


The Arts

The Arts this term, students delve deeper into Dance. They explore how different dance styles from past decades reflect the ideas, values, and trends of their time. They investigate how dancers use movement to express culture and communicate messages, and they apply this understanding by choreographing their own routines.

Japanese

Students develop their skills in reading, listening, and cultural understanding. They learn how to find key information from Japanese texts, translate familiar language, and explore important values and behaviours that are part of the Japanese society.



Digital Technologies

In Digital Technologies, students explain how digital systems use whole numbers as a basis for representing a variety of data types. They collect and validate data from a range of sources to assist in making judgements.
